





THE ARCHITECTURE OF WELL TEMPERED ENVIRONMENT an harmony of integrated instruments

International Conference

Eurosolar Italia jointly with **UIA/ARES** (Architecture and Renewable Energy Resources section of the Union International des Architectes) and the Board of the Architects **P.P.C. of Roma and Province** organises the International Conference "The Architecture of Well Tempered Environment - an harmony of integrated instruments", as a breathing space and preparatory event for the UIA World Conference that will take place in Tokyo next September 2011.

"Solar Energy in architecture and Urban Planning" is the integral part of the network of conferences on the topic organised by Eurosolar jointly with the European Union. The first conference was held in Munich in 1987; the following 5 subsequent Conferences in Paris 1989, Florence 1993, Berlin 1996, Bonn 1998 and 2000, constantly enhanced concepts and ideas of direct use of solar energy in buildings and for urban development. In this context the "European Solar Charta" was formulated at the conference in Berlin in 1996 under the auspices of Thomas Herzog and 30 solar architects. The "Solar Charta" has been translated in 10 languages and distributed around the world.

The international conference "The Architecture of Well Tempered Environment - an harmony of integrated instruments" aims to draw the attention to the challenge that Architecture and Urban Planning have to face in the path towards the environmental and economical sustainability. In the "De Architecture", by Vitruvius, the architect was supposed to manage entirely by himself the three pillars on which – according to him – was architecture based: firmitas, utilitas and venustas (durability, convenience, and beauty): the architect had all the necessary knowledge.

The architect continued for centuries to be the single actor of the design process, and this was maintained also when the building started to be filled with more and more technologies to provide comfort and services, requiring new skills; the only change being that the architect started to be more a "composer" and "orchestra director" than a "composer" and a "soloist". For some time he was able to master the new instruments introduced in the orchestra, i.e. the new technologies and the knowledge linked to them.

The emerging issues about energy and environment introduces in the orchestra new instruments and players, and it is more and more difficult for the architect/composer/director to direct them, also because architecture schools moved more and more towards the issues of venustas, i.e. the current idea of architectural beauty, leaving to other professionals the task to deal with firmitas and utilitas. The architect has to direct an orchestra in which there are many instruments about which he knows very little and therefore he cannot fully exploit their potential.

The emerging need for zero energy and sustainable architecture make necessary a new planning and design process, forgetting the soloist and the director and – instead – giving to the architect the *new role* of "*integrator*" of different kinds of know how into the architectural product.

Thus, architectural and urban planning will have to include on equal terms also the other professionals, bearer of their know how, enhancing it in a iterative and interactive process. There is no other way to unite in a modern way the three Vitruvius pillars and to fulfill the need for sustainable buildings and cities.

The aim of the conference is to focus on the new architectural design process for zero energy and sustainable buildings and on its impact on the architectural language and style. This issue will be treated either theoretically and by some selected design experiences of sustainable architecture told by their protagonists.
