Principles of free movement of goods

Goods lawfully sold in a Member State

Excpetion:

Member State's protection of a public interest

But only if well justified

Free movement of services

Service providers and service recipients

Construction is a service!



What does free movement of services mean?

National rules on services also have to aim to protect a public interest

Not all rules are acceptable




Product Contact Point (PCP)

The principle of mutual recognition applies- with exceptions

Provides information on product requirements

Assists companies wanting to import or export goods to Member States




The purpose and features of the PCP

Replies within 15 days

Services Directive


PSC available for companies selling services on the Internal Market



Effective problem solving in the internal market

- Helps citizens and businesses when national authorities do not apply EU law correctly
- Initiated by the Commission as an informal alternative in 2002
- One SOLVIT centre in each EU Member State working together
- Rapid and pragmatic solutions
- Free of charge

When can SOLVIT help?



Common SOLVIT cases

Persons: social security, right of entry and residence, recognition of

diplomas

Goods: mutual recognition, conformity assessments

Services: licence requirements

Capital: payments, property purchase



Statistics 2017

SOLVIT total

- 2100 cases
- Resolution rate: 87 %
- Average of 62 days to close a case

SOLVIT Sweden

- 123 cases
- Resolution rate: 45 %
- 70 % of cases closed within 70 days
